

Instructions For Using The REEP Rubric At BHCC

In – Class Writings FROM READINGS only can be reeped!
REEP training is available for reimbursement.

1. Study the five categories included in the **REEP RUBRIC DESCRIPTORS** and the reasons why each category can receive a score from 0 – 6.
2. Read the 6 **PERFECT SAMPLES** that have been scored a perfect 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 according to the REEP Rubric in each of the five categories; the experts scored these, so these samples should always guide us.
3. Read the 6 **BHCC SAMPLES** that reflect our BSL/ESL Levels at BHCC, from BSL Level 1 to ESL Level 3. Notice the REEP Score for each piece of writing and the comments.
4. Assess your students' in class writing with the REEP Rubric always looking at the samples mentioned above, especially the "PERFECT" ones. Score each of the five categories from 0 – 6: **whole numbers only**. Add the total score and divide by 5; this will give you a REEP Score. Only IN-CLASS writings can be reeped.

Less than 2.0	=	BSL 1
2.0 – 2.4	=	BSL 2
2.4 – 2.8	=	BSL 3
3.0 – 3.6	=	ESL 1
3.6 – 4.4	=	ESL 2
4.6 – 5.4	=	ESL 3

5. REEP your students' writings or pair up with a colleague or ask for the outside REEP Assessor. This person will reep score your students' writings. You should also reep them to see if scores are calibrated. If you are within 1 point of each other, you are calibrated.

EXIT CRITERIA

Writing Courses Students must score at the highest end of the range or higher for the level they are in. Students should write in-class in these courses at least three times.

Non-Writing Courses Students must score within the range for the level they are in. Students should write in-class in these courses at least two times.
